Activity Background

(Brief summary on the context of the underpinning your activity and description of the problem or issue(s) the activity sought to address. Include details on the objectives and approach/strategy to activity implementation)

It very important to state that Citizens' participation in the decision-making process has been guaranteed by various legal provisions. The 1992 Constitution stipulates how the state should engage citizens and how citizens should be involved in the decision-making process. The 1992 Constitution Article 1 of the 1st chapter of the Constitution affirms that the "sovereignty of Ghana resides in the people of Ghana in whose name and for whose welfare the powers of government are to be exercised in the manner and within the limits laid down in the Constitution".

Also, the Chapter 20 of the 1992 Constitution of Ghana stipulates that "to ensure accountability of Local Government authorities, people in particular Local Government areas shall, as far as practicable, be afforded the opportunity to participate effectively in their governance".

The Local Government Act provides for members of the District Assembly to consult with their electorates before and after Assembly meetings, as well as the participatory revocation of the mandate of an Assembly Member. Other LIs provide for the active participation of citizens in the sub-district structures. Additionally, the National Development Planning (System) Act provides for a decentralized participatory planning and budgeting. These and other articles give citizens the right to express themselves freely and participate in the decision-making process of the nation, both at the national or local level without restrictions. There are various ways through which citizens participate in local governance and influence the decision-making process. These include: Participation in elections (voice) and referenda, Community or Town Hall Meetings, Public education and communication campaigns, Public Meetings or Public Hearing called by Assembly Members or the District Assembly.

Despite all these platforms, there is still limited participation of citizens in the planning and budgeting of the District Assembly's activities which has led to the inability of the Assembly to meet the needs of their citizens and has adversely resulted in poor road poor service delivery.

To help create an impact in tackling the issue of participation by citizens in the Medium Term Development Plan, Resource Link Foundation through the 'I AM AWARE' project mobilized citizens in the Afigya Kwabre South and Dormaa East Districts to take part in a Public hearing on the approved MTDP for the 2022-2025 in their respective districts.

As a strategy to build upon previous activities and engagements with state and non-state actors to ensure improvement in service delivery, there is the need to design activities with the aim of building up on emerging issues so that they could be addressed. These activities are aimed at addressing bottlenecks that hinder service delivery outcomes in IAA specific sectors, thus education and health as well as other related issues in the 'I AM AWARE' Districts.

The proposed activities included;

Active and inclusive participation of citizens through Public hearing on the Planned and approved MTDP and budget 2022-2025

This public hearing has helped to create awareness and sensitize community and religious leaders, the media, men and boys and different generations to counter social norms that restrict youth and women's rights and participation in public life and decision-making and to take deliberate action to adjust them;

The women and youth participation will strengthen an enabling environment for youth and women's participation in public life and decision-making by addressing poverty and unemployment challenges, unpaid care burden, unequal access to sexual and reproductive health and rights, education and technology, and fostering skills-development;

Media inclusive of the youth and women will also help in creating an incentivized media, advertising, film and television industries to reverse gender-based discrimination in the portrayal of women leaders in public life and decision-making; All-inclusive in this forum will help to enhance knowledge of how to support Fundraise and support public information campaigns with positive messages and images of youth and women's role in public life to help change stereotypes

2.1 Comments, Key Issues or Challenges

Comments/outcomes

- The medium term development plan was validated by key stakeholders; state and non-stake actors.
- Gaps identified were addressed to the satisfaction of stakeholders.
- Citizens had the opportunity to listen to the approved plan and gave their comments on the activities

Challenges

- There was a gap on service inputs and infrastructural inputs from sector heads. It was observed that many sector heads submitted service inputs; workshops and sensitization programs meanwhile the citizenry that attended the hearing made calls for the inclusion of infrastructural projects in the respective sectors, substantiating their calls with the challenges they face as a result of absence of these infrastructures in their respective communities
- Change/transfer of duty bearers. The DPO in the district had just been transferred to the district and looked absolutely new to happenings in the district making things a bit difficult
- Low attendance from community members

Recommendations

- Sector heads need to up their game and work collaboratively with the Planning Officer to consolidate inputs into the MTDP
- Stakeholders and experts should regularly be brought together to discuss issues of concern and design a proper course of action to improve situations. The forum was

actually participatory and interactive as participants were vocal and asked questions for clarifications.

2.2 Lessons Learnt and Opportunities

- The public hearing was an opportunity for citizens to validate their inputs and duty bearers to make changes or additions to the drafted plan for the period
- Members of the public had the opportunity to register their displeasure on service delivery in the district
- Bringing duty bearers and citizens together for discussion has always proven to be an effective way to ensure accountability and transparency.
- It was an opportunity to showcase the major role SAG members played in the mobilizing of community members for inputs during the needs assessment
